SRO Speed Week (19-21/07/2019)

Art 1 – Definition

This meeting will be contested according to the FIA International Sporting Code and its appendices, the Sporting & Technical Regulations of the Championship concerned and the present Supplementary Regulations. Modifications, amendments and/or changes to the present Supplementary Regulations will only be announced by means of dated and numbered Additives (published by the organizer or the stewards). Art 5 – Scrutineering, Parc Fermé & Tyre Registration

- a. Technical Scrutineering, Car Safety Checks and Driver's Equipment Checks take place in the team awnings on Thursday 18/07/2019 from 15h00 to 18h00.
- b. Championship Scales will be in the BRDC British Formula 3 Technical Awning.
- c. Post scrutineering takes place at the Scrutineering Awnings.
- d. Leaving the track after finish practice(s): Until the Clerk of the Course has finished the timed practice/qualification, all concerned cars may not leave the track/pitlane, except through exit on the way to Parc Fermé, or to be taken into a closed pitbox.
- e. Leaving the track after finish race(s): 1st, 2nd and 3rd will be stopped under the Podium with the remainder of the grid going back to the awnings under parc fermé conditions until checks have been completed.
- f. The route for cars to go from the awnings to the pre-grid area, and from the track back to the awnings will be confirmed during the Briefing.

Art 6 – Entry: closing date and acceptance

This event is open for drivers holding a national grade A licence (or higher). The fee required (see entry form and/or confirmation of participating) has to be paid before the event (an entry not accompanied by the fee shall be null and void).

Art 7 – Collection of documents/Sporting Checks

The sporting checks (licence) will take place in the F1 Paddock – 1st Floor – Room 132 on Friday 19/07/2019 from 08h00 to 08h15

The entrant and the driver, or their officially nominated representative must be present at the place and the time indicated for the administrative checks and for the scrutineering. At the administrative checks the entrant and/or driver must show their licence, and – if applicable – an entrant's licence.

Drivers from outside Belgium or comparable countries by decision of the FIA need a special authorization of their own ASN (FIA ISC Art. 2.6 and 3.9).

For minor competitors a "Parental Consent Authorisation" confirmed by the country Authority should be presented at Sporting Checks.

Art 8 – Time schedule: Timed Practices, Pre- scrutineering and Races

See official time schedules.

- Free Practice: 3 x 45 minutes
- Qualifying Session: 25 minutes
- Race: 3 x 20 minutes

Art 9 – Protests and Appeals

According Art. 13 of the FIA Sporting Code International protests have to be addressed to the Chairman of the Stewards

and delivered to the Clerk of the Course (or assistant). In absence of the Clerk of the Course, the protest should be delivered to the Chairman of the Stewards.

Protest & National Appeal Fee : according the regulations of the Parent ASN of the Series
International Appeal Fee (FIA) : € 6.000,-

Art 10 – Driver’s Briefing

A briefing will be held on Friday 19/07/2019 at 08h15. Briefing is mandatory for all drivers and team chefs. A fine of 250€ will be charged for non-presence at the briefing(s). For location: see Art. 4.

- location and how to get there:

Brussels : 145km - +/- 80 minutes (Brussels National Airport – Zaventem – Belgium)

Liège : 60km - +/- 45 minutes (Liège Airport – Bierset – Belgium)

Maastricht : 75km - +/- 60 minutes (Maastricht Airport – Maastricht – The Netherlands)

Luxemburg : 120km - +/- 90 minutes (Luxemburg Airport – Luxemburg)

- length of one lap: 7.004 m

- duration of the race: 3 x 20 minutes

- direction: clockwise

Art 12 – Insurance for the meeting

Subject: Fire safety – paddock requirements

Transportation and transferral of flammable materials:

- the total quantity transported cannot exceed 240l per unit of transportation
- use securely closed metal containers with a maximum capacity of 60 litres
- compulsory presence of an assistant equipped with an extinguisher (6 kg powder or 6 l foam)
- no combustible items within proximity of transported hydrocarbon (eg. tyres)
- no smoking or naked flames; keep away from ignited items, sparks, welding, etc.
- containers must be kept closed at all times whether empty or full
- transportation must be made in a utility vehicle designed for carrying loads
- correct electrical connection between the metallic container and earth before filling or emptying; during these operations the containers must be unloaded from the vehicle in advance
- it is prohibited to enter the loading area of a covered vehicle transporting flammable liquids with mobile lighting equipment other than designed and built to avoid igniting flammable vapours which may have been released within the interior

Where the transportation is made by towing:

- the towing vehicle must be capable of towing and braking the load
- the tyres of the trailer must be suited to the type of ground in question and to the speeds reached by the towing vehicle
- the towing hook and trailer attachment must be CE approved
- a safety cable or chain secured to the trailing arm must be used to connect the towing hook
- each barrel must be individually secured
- a technical steward or judge of fact shall be present while the pumps are opened to ensure that these safety regulations are observed and to sanction those in breach.

Handling fuel within the stand:

- no fuel may be handled in the pitlane

No smoking or naked flames:

- in the entire area around the tanker lorry
- in the pit lane, in the stands, and within 5 metres of the back of the stands
- above the stands (lodges, mezzanines)

No LPG cylinders:

- in the pit lane, in the stands, and within 5 metres of the back of the stands
- in any vehicle (authorised in tents and under awnings)

No occupation of clearances:

- all paddock road clearances
- a 1-metre clearance behind the stands
- N.B. authorised behind stands: lorry platform if lowered
- ribbons marking the limits of the stand if easily crossed

Conformity of electrical or gas installations:

- obligation to meet standards
- protection of electrical or gas supply lines.
